On Saturday, April 2nd, I ventured out to Planes of Fame at the Chino Airport to see their GM TBM-3e Avenger fly. It was worth the trip. The Avenger is a large airplane carrying a crew of three. You may be aware that this is the aircraft that President G. W. Bush was flying when he was shot down in the Pacific during WW2. The plane cruises at around

150-170 knots and consumes about 70 gallons of fuel an hour at these speeds. Top speed is about 250 knots. As a torpedo/bomber the plane isn't very maneuverable. It appears to have been an easy target. I have included photographs from the event.

Upcoming Fun-Flys




