It's that time of year again! If you'vew not already done so, please mail your membership application and fees to Don. You can find the application and instructions on <u>our website</u>. Please remember to include a copy of your 2024 A.M.A. membership with your paperwork.

As I have previously mentioned, The F.R.I.A. (FAA Recognized Identification Area) applications for Del Cerro Park and Entradero Park have been approved and the <u>FAA map</u> confirms it.

The Entradero Park flying boundaries on the F.R.I.A. map are not accurate. Part of the flying area is not within the shaded area. I am working to get this corrected. The F.A.A. is focused on reducing the

F.R.I.A. application backlog, so it may take awhile to get the boundaries corrected.

With the recent wind and rain, flying

opportunities have been limited. I've been working on a few projects. But because I am a sucker for WW2 aircraft, I've been heading out to the local museums. Over the past two months, <u>Planes of Fame</u> at the Chino Airport has flow their P-40, Mitsubishi Zero and Mig 15. Pretty cool stuff.


