displayed by their owners at the museum. The volunteers put a lot of work into the aircraft and many of the aircraft are undergoing restoration.

The museum used to give rides in their C-47 until a ground loop damaged a wing and a hydraulic leak torched an engine and nacelle. The wing has been replaced and the nacelle is being rebuilt. This C-47 was built in 1947 in Long Beach, CA. Its real claim to fame is its long history. It flew
