

## Message from the President

May 2019

Whoosh! ... and April is gone. It is amazing how quickly the days fly by.

In the mid-nineties, I worked at Northrop Aircraft on the development of the F/A-18 E/F Super Hornet. It was a thrill watching the first aircraft get in the air and follow the progress during the flight test program. In parallel with this activity, some of my co-workers were working on the restoration to flight of the Planes of Fame Museum owned Northrop N9M flying wing. The first flight of the N9M was a huge accomplishment and was as exciting for the folks that worked on it as seeing the Super Hornet Fly.

Seeing the N9M fly at the Torrance Air Show, when it was still held, or at Chino was always a thrill. It was tragic to hear that it crashed last week, taking the pilot's

life in the accident. The plane was completely destroyed. I was looking forward to seeing this predecessor of the B-2 Bomber fly at Chino next weekend. Info about he plane and crash can be found here.

The annual <u>Planes of Fame Air Show</u> at the Chino airport is scheduled for this coming weekend, May

4-5th. This show is always a great opportunity to see a lot of warbirds fly.

Bob Okita never seems to stop building. At last month's meeting Bob brought a 4.5 ounce glider compiled from a hand launch free-flight glider wing and some spare components he had in the workshop. He described it to me as follows:

"Well, it's made from stuff I had lying around. It has

two cheap China 4.3g servos, a 6 channel Minima (HiTec compatible) receiver, a 210 mah LiPo, about 10 grams of lead ballast, a 34 inch WS rubber band launch glider I picked up as part of a "buy", 30 pound Spectra fishing leader for a pull control system, a revised tail cut from 1/16 inch balsa sheet. Some experimentation for CG location (was required) to compromise between hi speed and low speed aerodynamics'. Since it weighs only 4.7 oz, there is very little stress to the shoulder during launch. Being so light, it has amusing "flittering" flight characteristics during both flat-land and especially slope flight."

boat that he enjoys motoring around at the local parks. Lonnie stated that the boat is outfitted with components he had around the shop and is fun to operate.


