We will be holding a meeting this coming Wednesday, May7th at 7:30 PM at La Romeria Park. I plan to bring 4-5 un-built kits that need re-homing, free to those who attend. If you are coming to the meeting, please bring along your latest project and discuss it with the members in attendance. I look forward to seeing you on Wednesday!

Our 2025 A.M.A. PSF club charter has been approved and our field insurance policies are in place. John is working with the City of Rancho Palos Verdes to process our Del Cerro Park badges

from the City. Thanks John. Once, again thanks to Don for processing the Charter and member applications for the club.

The A.M.A. has been working to get the maximum height flyable at club flying sights increased for RC aircraft. To that end, the allowable altitude has been increased for certain fields, depending on the proximity of the field to airports and their approaches. Due to the proximity of Entradero Park to Torrance Airport, the limit is 400 feet AGL. Del which is its machifound on the FAA website, which can be accessed from this A.M.A article.

The RC Super Show was held last month at the Fairplex in Pomona. The

number of RC aircraft-related vendors was limited, even though the event was co-sponsored by the A.M.A. Prior to the COVID-19 outbreak in 2019-2020, the A.M.A. convention had experienced decreased participation by both vendors and enthusiasts. The A.M.A had announced that they would no longer hold the convention due to the lack of attendance. COVID sealed the deal on the convention for several years. I give the A.M.A kudos for trying to reestablish the annual show, but with

the lack of vendor participation, it will be difficult to build attendance and grow the event.

I had limited opportunities to fly in April, due to some significant projects here at the house. When I did get out to fly it was at the Avenues in Redondo Beach, flying small stuff in the afternoons. I heard

through the grapevine that flying at Cal State Dominguez Hills is definitely shut down. Let us know where you have been flying and we will compile a list of usable sites beyond Entradero Park and Del Cerro Park. Our two

flying fields have always been unique in the area and are quickly becoming rare.
